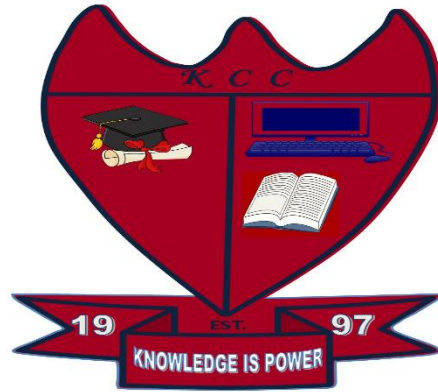

ADMISSION POLICY

KCC Primary school attempts to play its part in the rebuilding of society in South Africa by providing access to a quality education for all pupils on merit. We are directed by national policies and the principles we create.

The Admission Policy is based on Section 5(5) of the South African schools' Act, 1996 (no. 84 of 1996) and is consistent with the Government Gazette Notice 2432 of 1998 with regard to the Admission Policy for Ordinary Public Schools.

KCC Primary school accommodates firstly, pupils from surrounding schools. Learners seeking admission to the school must fill in an application form collected from the school or downloaded from the internet and pay a current application processing fee. The completed application form must then be submitted with the original school report from the previous school, transfer letter,

certified copy of identity document of the learner and the parents / guardians. On receiving the completed application form, the admission committee will phone to verify how genuine the report from the previous school is and also verify the correctness of the physical and postal addresses of the parents / guardians as well as verify the telephone numbers given on the application form. The committee must then issue an admission number to the learner and record it in the Admission Register.
